God's Own Peace: Systems Theory and Spirituality

Since the publication in 1985 of Dr. Edwin Friedman's *Generation to Generation*, many pastors and other church leaders have become aware of Bowen family systems theory as a way of understanding human functioning. This workshop suggests some implications of faith perspectives for family systems theory. It takes seriously recent research into how the brain changes as people engage in meditative prayer. And it introduces participants to simple, classically grounded approaches to meditation. While offering no "quick fix," this workshop will point participants toward a life-long approach to change with profound implications for personal faith and functioning. Pastors and others will discover resources and strategies for enhanced effectiveness and health when providing leadership in anxious church systems.
